

Appomattox Court House, New Virginia

April 10 1865

Agreement entered into this day in regard to the Surrender of the Army of Northern Virginia to the United States Authorities.

1st The troops shall march by Regiments and March
units to a designated point, stock their Arms, deposit
their Hops, Sabres, Pistols, etc. and ^{from} there march to their
homes under charge of their Officers, superintended by their
respective Division and Corps Commanders, Officers re-
taining their side Arms, and the authorized number of
private horses.

2^d All public Horses and public property of all
kinds to be turned over to staff Officers designated by the
United States Authorities.

3^d Such transportation as may be agreed upon as
necessary for the transportation of the private baggage of
Officers will be allowed to accompany the Officers, to be
turned over at the end of the trip, to the nearest
U.S. Recruiting Station receipt being taken for the same.

4th Canteens and Mended wear of the
Army and Cavalry when Horses are their own private
property will be allowed to retain them.

5. The surrender of the Army of Northern Virginia shall be construed to include, all the forces operating with that Army on the 9th inst., the date of cessation of operations, for surrender, except, such as bodies of Cavalry as actually made their escape, previous to the surrender, and except, also such forces of Artillery as were more than Twenty (20) miles from Appomattox Court House at the time of surrender on the 9th inst.
