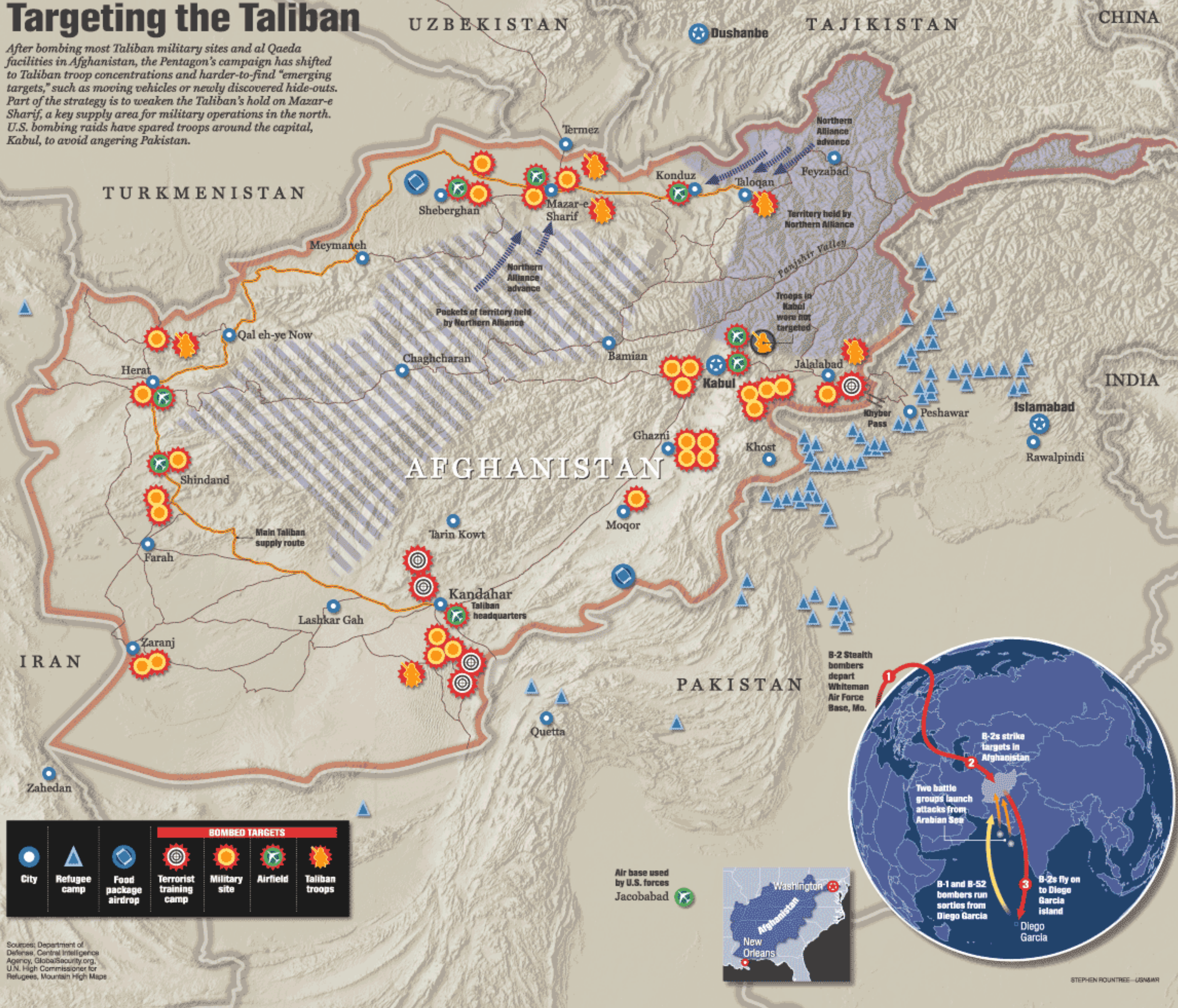


Targeting the Taliban

After bombing most Taliban military sites and al Qaeda facilities in Afghanistan, the Pentagon's campaign has shifted to Taliban troop concentrations and harder-to-find "emerging targets," such as moving vehicles or newly discovered hide-outs. Part of the strategy is to weaken the Taliban's hold on Mazar-e Sharif, a key supply area for military operations in the north. U.S. bombing raids have spared troops around the capital, Kabul, to avoid angering Pakistan.
